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Season Volume comparison of 1st Air and Sea lodgements to MPI 18/19 and 19/20

19/20 Application Volumes were higher than 18/19 season and covid-19 impact:

- in Feb/March 2020 sea freight volumes dropped for the first time below the 18/19 volumes.
- A decrease can also be seen in airfreight applications.

Turnaround of lodgements

Although Operational performance targets were not met in August – end of November the majority of applications were completed within OPT and the remaining Lodgements screened close to the OPT. Agents experienced a 3 day (72 hour) turnaround even in the busiest months November /December 2019. Note: Therefore the OPT measures do not necessarily indicate that there is an immediate problem in turn around times.

Observations 18/19 & 19/20 BMSB season

Industry Notifications – sent out weekly – forecasting based on the previous weeks, proved to be accurate and stable, updates included volumes, OPT's, and the most frequently asked questions of the week.

- Draft standards for VMP and Seaco were released to Industry 14/05/2020
- BMSB Industry Survey "Have your say" was released 11/05/2020
- Over the 8 month BMSB season : CEC staff <u>BMSB@mpi.govt.nz</u> answered 4,466 enquiries and the Standards Team answered 597 enquiries.
- Priority clearances and queue priorities maintained manifest inbox volumes low.
- The Australian queue sea freight queue worked well.
- No Demurrage, storage, detention claims to MPI TET (in relation to processing times) received.





Compliance with mandatory offshore treatment requirements for VMP and Seaco19/20 BMSB

10644 Lodgements were screened by TET, of those 528 BACC's were generated "Hold on Board" for example due to "no evidence of offshore treatments conducted presented to TET at the time of lodgement".

Approximately 500 of these were then resolved by submitting the offshore TR certificates.

Less than 2% of VMP consignments were assessed by the standards team and fumigated on arrival under various CTOd directions.

SEACO

Italian containers required fumigation offshore, only sensitive containers were directed for "MPI supervised devan" on arrival .

- TET directed 1740 containers for MPI supervised devan

- 89 BACC were generated with "Hold on Board" due to non conformance " for example no treatment conducted offshore".
