Vigilance as a Responsibility

- ► RACAs are on the front line of air cargo security and must remain vigilant in identifying, reporting, and preventing security risks.
- ▶ Vigilance is not just about following procedures but being proactive in safeguarding the system.



Adapting to Changes in the Threat Environment

RACAs need to stay informed about trends in security and adapt to new challenges by proactively adjusting their practices to stay ahead of emerging threats by keeping security culture front of mind and always maintaining vigilance throughout their operation.



The Importance of a Strong Security Culture

- Security is a collective, ongoing commitment from RACAs that is embedded in the workplace culture, not just a set of rules.
- ► RACAs play a key role in creating a security-first environment that helps protect air cargo systems.



Everyone's Responsibility

- ► Security is a shared responsibility, from leadership to frontline staff.
- ► RACAs should foster a sense of shared responsibility, ensuring that everyone understands their role in safeguarding the air cargo supply chain.



Prompt Reporting and Information Sharing

- RACAs should promote the "Hear it, See it, Report it" mantra, encouraging RACAs to report suspicious activities or security incidents.
- ► Sharing valuable information through timely reporting can help identify larger security threats and mitigate risks at an early stage.


Mitigating Insider Threats
